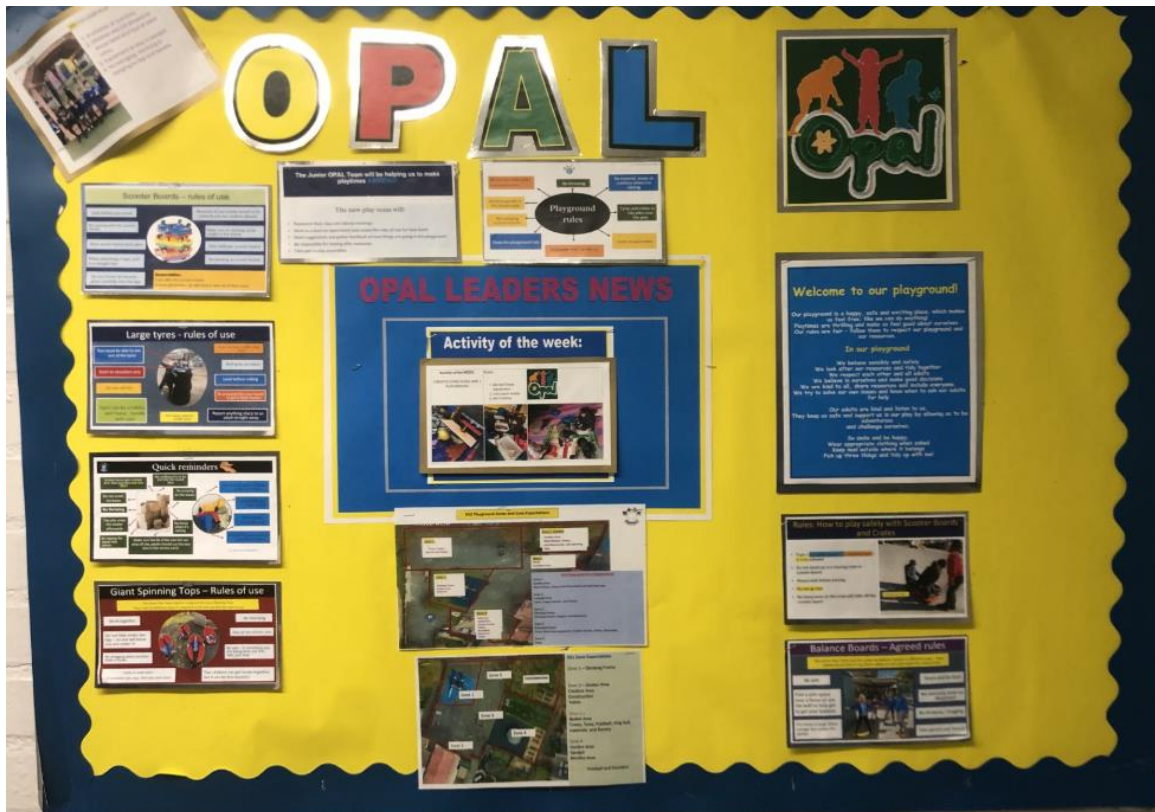

**Thinking**

- Think before you do something

**Checking**

- See if it's safe to walk /climb on  
(ask someone if you are not sure)

**Looking**

- Make sure its not broken before using it.
