The Junior OPAL Team had fun experimenting with the decking planks and deciding on the rules of use.

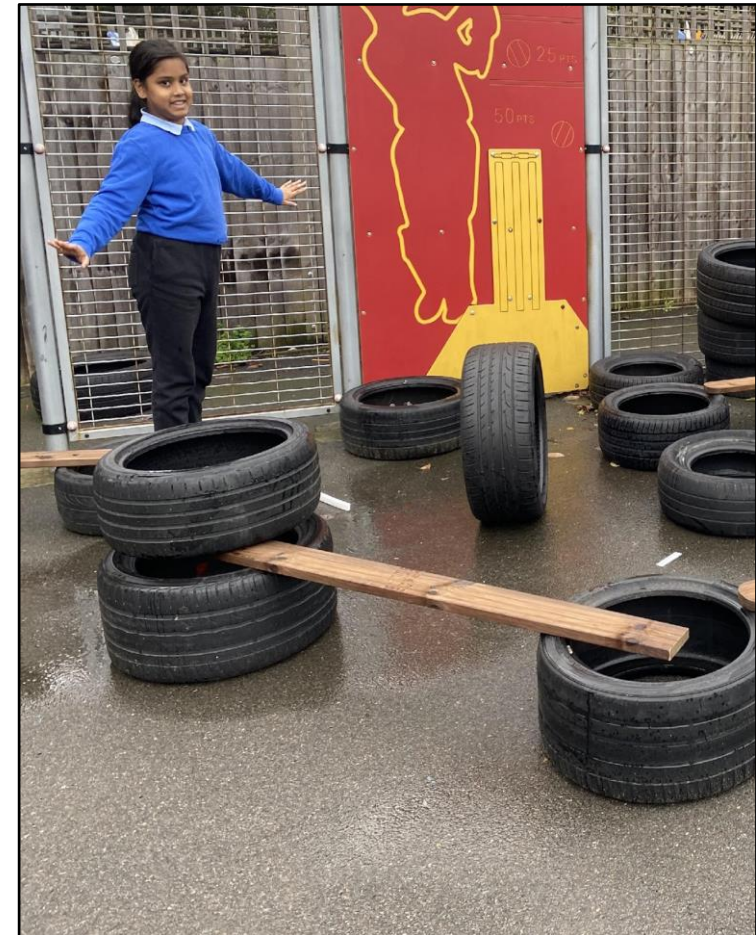


# Decking Planks

- Allowed height: **Maximum of two tyres high**
- What you can use them with: **Tyres and Crates.**
- Where you can play with them: **near tyres and crates.**



Put away in the large box  
under the shelter



# Decking Planks – rules of use



**No throwing or hitting each other with the planks.**



**Do not try and break them.**



**Must stay near the tyres and crates. Not on football pitch or climbing frame**



**Do use the planks to build with.**



**Use with crates and tyres**



**Check if its safe – make sure the plank does not flick up when you walk on it!**



**Do have fun using your imagination to create something amazing!**



# Quick reminders



Stack no higher than your shoulders



No throwing

No rolling fast

Put tyres away on the right – away from the house

Anything sharp – let an adult know.

If heavy, two children to pick up

Anything sharp or broken - let an adult know straight away

No throwing

Not higher than your waist

No jumping - not a trampoline

Put crates away on the left of the house

Can jump off, but not higher than knees

No joining of two crates with rope

Must put cardboard in first when dragging the crates with ropes







# Quick reminders



Broken boxes get crushed first, then put into **cow bins ONLY**

No cardboard is to be put into the round bins

Do not smash the boxes

**No throwing**

Tidy pile under the shelter afterwards

No ripping the boxes into pieces



No jumping on the boxes.

Not out when raining.

Make sure the lid of the cow bin can close (if not, adults should use the cow bins in the service yard).



Put all fabric away in the box at the end of play

Do not swirl the fabric around

No wrapping around the neck

If its raining, please do not take out the fabrics



# Playground reminders

Be kind to each other and share items

No throwing

Football on the football pitch only

No kicking balls in the playground

Tyres and crates in tidy piles near the cricket board area

Keep the playground tidy

Everyone helps to tidy up

Listen to each other

# Playground Rules:

Who is going to be getting them out?

Everybody has to tidy up at the end of play times.

When the whistle goes, look around and help each other to put everything away.

Even if you have not played with something, you need to help tidy up.

Who is going to be tidying them away?

If we're not listening to adults, then we won't be able to play with the resources.

Too many disputes means they'll be taken away.
