Dynamic Risk Management

means

Knowing how to be safe

by

Being sensible

- Thinking about what you have made or what you are about to do

Checking

- See if it's safe to walk /climb on

(ask someone if you are not sure)

Being aware

- Make sure its not broken before using it.

The rules of use for each item in the playground helps you to think about how to be safe and have fun!

Giant Spinning Tops – Rules of use

Junior OPAL TEAM RULES

Work together

No throwing

No dragging when
another child is inside

Do not hide under the top
– no one will know you
are under it!



Stay on the grass area

Be safe – if something
you are doing does
not feel safe, just
stop.

Listen to each other –
if someone says stop, then you must stop!

Balance Boards – Agreed rules

Be safe

Find a safe space near a fence or use the wall to help get to get your balance.

Put away in large black storage box under the shelter



Share and be kind

No slamming down on the ground

No throwing / dragging

One person per board

Use on the grass in the garden area or in the main part of the playground.

Keep away from the climbing frame, football pitch and kingball area.

Scooter Boards – rules of use

Look before you move

No running with the scooter boards

Share and be kind to each other

When attaching a rope, pull in a straight line.

Do not throw the boards – place carefully into the box



Maximum of two scooter boards to be joined & only two children allowed.

Make sure no clothing can be caught in the wheels

One child per scooter board

No standing on scooter boards

Responsibilities:

Look after the scooter boards.

If some get broken, we will have to take all of them away

Rules: How to play safely with Scooter Boards and Crates

- Train = 2 scooter boards + 1 skipping rope + 1 crate allowed.
- Do not stand up in a moving crate or scooter board.
- Always look before moving
- **Do not go fast**
- No sharp turns or the crate will slide off the scooter board.
- Crates can be tied to scooter board.





Be kind to each other and share items

No throwing

Football on the football pitch only

No kicking balls in the playground

Playground reminders

Tyres and crates in tidy piles near the cricket board area

Keep the playground tidy

Everyone helps to tidy up

Listen to each other

Playground Rules:

Who is going to be getting them out?

Everybody has to tidy up at the end of play times.

When the whistle goes, look around and help each other to put everything away.

Even if you have not played with something, you need to help tidy up.

Who is going to be tidying them away?

If we're not listening to adults, then we won't be able to play with the resources.

Too many disputes means they'll be taken away.
