No snatching or biting the lego.


Keep Lego pieces on the mat

Must stay under the shelter




When the whistle goes, all Lego creations must be put back into the red boxes.


(we can't save anything that has been made)



CREATIVE AREA




- -knit

- Thinking about what you have made or what you are about to do

Checking

 See if it's safe to walk /climb on (ask someone if you are not sure)

Being aware

Make sure its not broken before using it.

No kicking balls in the playground

Playground reminders

Tyres and crates in tidy piles near the cricket board area

Keep the playground tidy

Everyone helps to tidy up

Listen to each other





Playground Rules:

Who is going to be getting them out?

Everybody has to tidy up at the end of play times.

When the whistle goes, look around and help each other to put everything away.

Even if you have not played with something, you need to help tidy up.
