LEARNING THROUGH PLAY IN EYFS

Scientists have discovered that it takes approximately 400 repetitions to create a new synapse in the brain, unless it is done in play, in which case it only takes 10 to 20 repetitions.

When children play, they are learning at the highest level.

Play can extend certain areas of their learning – for example, developing language skills by promoting talk between children or introducing new vocabulary that they use and act out in their play.



Reading Records – please write any comments as we love to hear how your child is doing at home!



At Sebright we are teaching children to become masters of number!




Have a go at home ...
